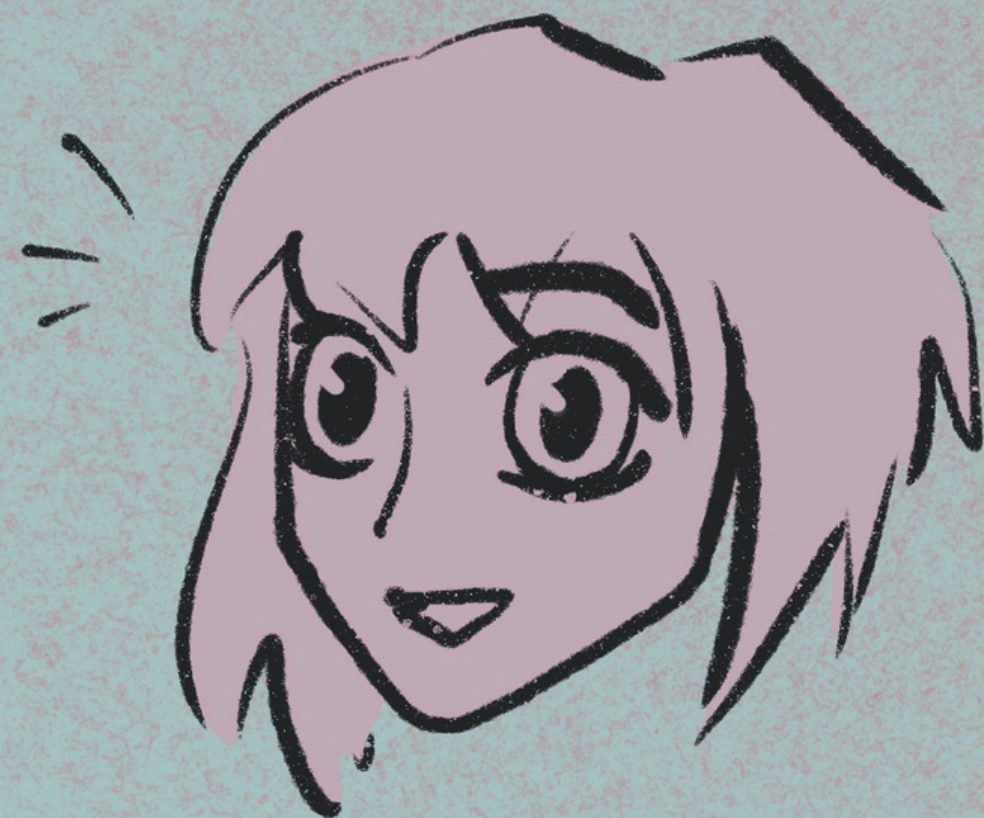


# STYLE

Focused on capturing a moment, emphasizing light & its changing nature.



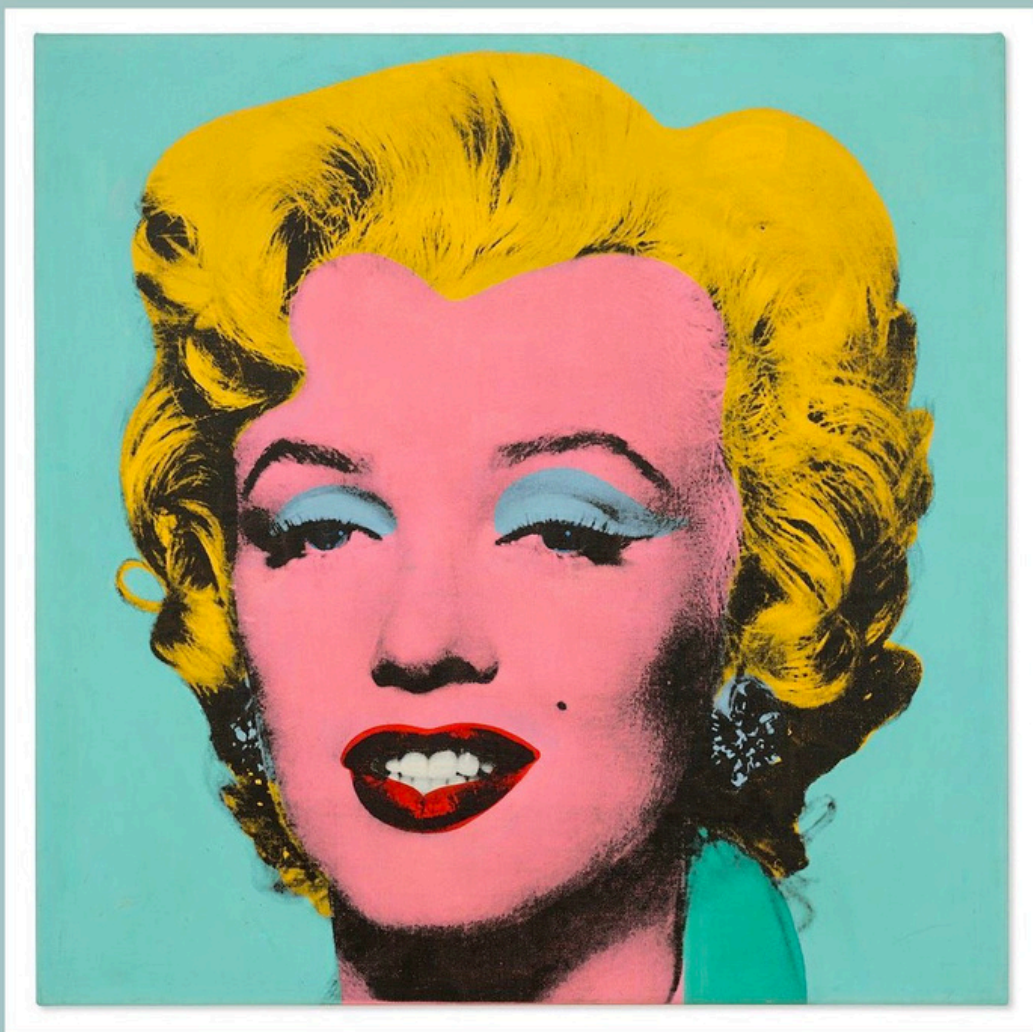

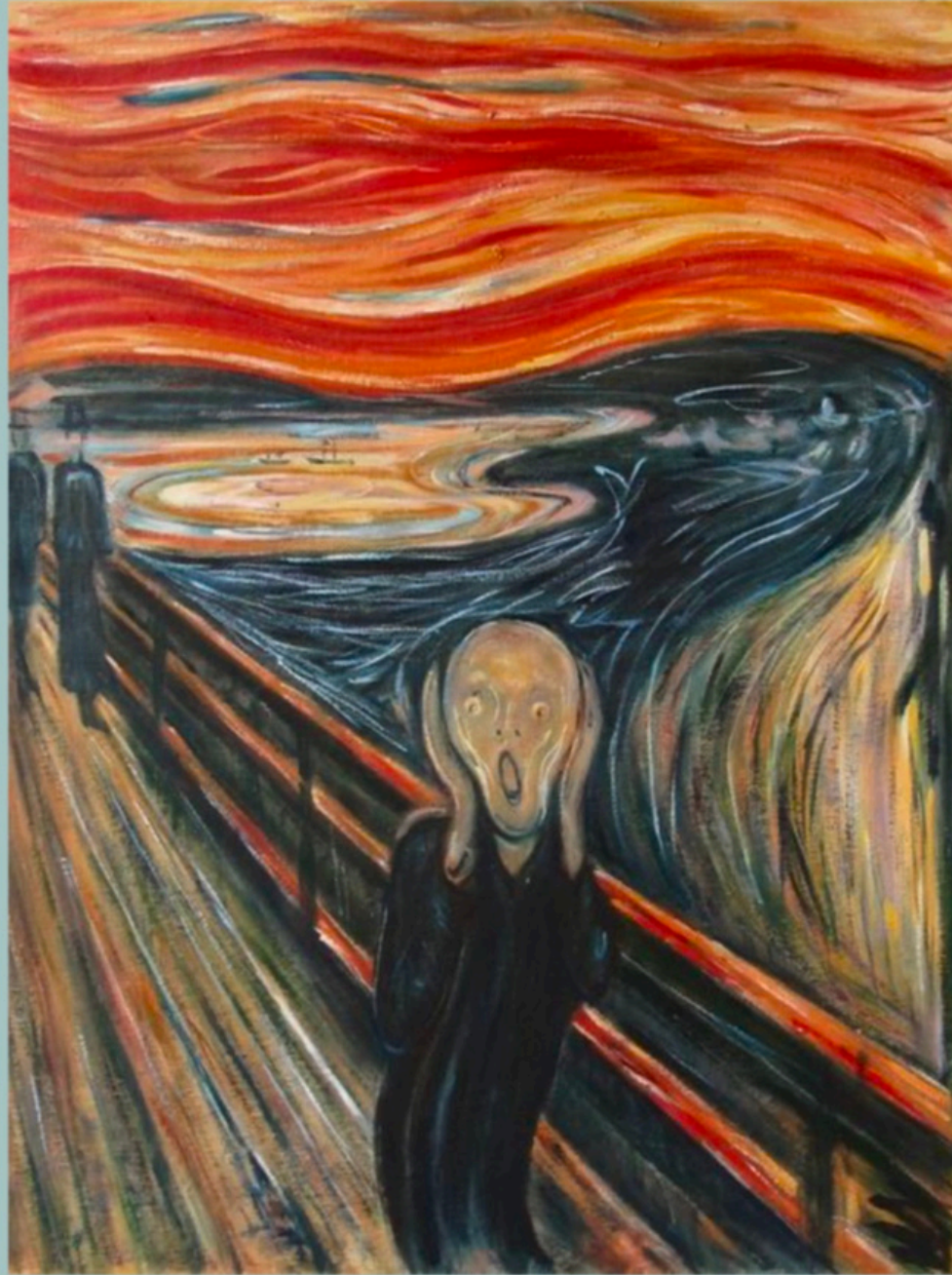
